

### Economic Independence

#### **Broward County HSD/CPD/ Ryan White Part A Program, \$60,000**

Peer Counselor Certification Initiative

This is a pilot program that will train 20 HIV positive individuals who are underemployed to be Peer Counselors. Once training is complete, they will be employed with an Ryan White Part A HIV/AIDS service provider.

#### **Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Miami, Inc., \$55,000**

Navigation Center

A new family enrichment specialist will work with 25 adults to create a pathway to obtain a job that will increase their income. The project includes job readiness and financial literacy training that will help them improve their credit score so that they can leave the program more stable and confident.

#### **Hispanic Unity of Florida, Inc., \$50,000**

The Bridge Program

This program will enhance a current program through additional workforce education, vocational training, job placement and financial literacy services to 50 participants who are either unemployed or underemployed. Participants will obtain the skills necessary to acquire or improve employment in the Customer Service or Retail Sales workforce. After completing the training and/or certification they should be able to acquire gainful employment that will increase their net income.

#### **The Salvation Army of Broward County, Inc., \$55,000**

Bridges Out of Poverty

Twenty individuals who are living paycheck to paycheck will secure a better job that will increase their income by 15%. The participants will go through a 17-week program to learn how to set goals that will help them improve their financial status, secure a better job, get out of debt, etc.

#### **Sheridan House Family Ministries, Inc., \$15,000**

Single Moms Program

Fifty-five single mothers in crisis will receive stable housing for up to 18-months in the new "Single Moms Villas". Participants will learn how to manage their finances, secure a job that increases their income by up to 25% and move into their own home. Each mother will pay monthly "dues" that will help prepare them for the cost of living once they move out. Once they move out the "dues" will be returned for subsequent living expenses.

#### **Children's Home Society of Florida, Inc., \$40,000**

Bridges of Broward

25 families in crisis will receive assistance. A case manager will work closely with them to set up individual goals that include securing a better job, stable housing, completing a GED, and/or enrolling in technical/vocational programs, etc.

#### **Jack & Jill Children's Center, Inc., \$30,000**

Whole Family Strengthening

30 individuals who are living paycheck to paycheck will be assisted. In partnership with OIC South Florida, technical and vocational training will be offered to the participants that include Information Technology and Advance Manufacture certification.

### **Legal Aid Service of Broward County, Inc., \$25,000**

ALICE LEAP - Legal Empowerment and Assistance Project (LEAP) for Women

This program will continue to remove legal barriers for 20 Broward women in a crisis situation, assisting them with their legal issues and creating a path for future prosperity. Participants will receive help enrolling in educational classes, obtaining degrees and seeking employment that will positively improve their financial future.

## **Youth WORK**

### **Art and Culture Center of Hollywood, Inc., \$35,000**

Arts Aspire

This program is an extension of a current program and will provide 30 youth with hands-on learning experiences that focus on different career opportunities in the arts. Depending on the age of the youth, they will work in the Center's Education Department and take part in arts inspired classes, camps, exhibitions, distant learning broadcasts, assist with lighting and sound designs for performances and more. Participants are eligible for stipends and transportation assistance.

### **Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County, Inc., \$50,000**

Workforce Development Initiative

This program will provide 20 youth with a Customer Service certification and connections to part-time jobs in their neighborhoods or at their local club. Youth Development Professionals will work closely with the youth and companies to monitor the "on the job" growth and success for both the employer and the employee. Current companies participating include Wawa, McDonalds, Wendy's, and Publix.

### **Center for Independent Living of Broward, Inc., \$40,000**

Jobs for Youth

This program will prepare and introduce 60 youth with disabilities to the workforce. Through the Business Advisory Council and the assistance of Youth Services Coordinators, the youth will participate in mock interviewing and learn independent living skills to prepare them for a 6-8 week paid internship. Partners include: Royal Caribbean Cruises, Joann Fabrics, Dunkin' Donuts, Publix, Penn Dutch and more.

### **Covenant House Florida, Inc., \$45,000**

Youth Employment Services (YES) Program

This program will provide 50 unemployed and homeless youth with a four-week paid internship that may lead to a permanent job. A Job Readiness Training Coordinator will work with the youth to prepare them for the workforce before the internship period. Partners include: Riverside Hotel, Hilton Hotels, Birch State Park, Publix and more.

### **The School Board of Broward County, Florida, \$45,000**

Pre-Apprenticeship

A pilot program that will give 60 high school seniors technical employment skills and OSHA 10 industry certification that can lead to employment after graduation in the HVAC, plumbing, electric and carpentry fields. The youth will meet during and after school to learn the trade and work as a paid pre-apprentice over the summer to earn the certification. In addition, they will earn credits toward college or enrollment into a full apprenticeship program upon graduation.

### **Junior Achievement of South Florida, Inc., \$50,000**

Job Developer

A new Job Developer will be hired to secure employment opportunities for youth to engage in during the school year and summer break. This will include previous and newly enrolled program participants for a total minimum of 25 youth served.

### **Jewish Adoption and Foster Care Options, Inc., \$40,000**

#### JAFCO Youth WORK Program

This program will provide job preparation and paid placement for 12 youth in foster care. The youth will work on the campus in capacities such as camp counselor, tutor, front desk, maintenance, etc. A Life Coach will work closely with the youth and teach them life and soft skills as well as therapy needed to ensure a smooth transition into life after foster care.

### **PACE Center for Girls Broward, Inc., \$45,000**

#### We Can Do It!

This program will continue to provide 40 at-risk girls ages 14-21 years old with employability training through the help of a College and Career Readiness Coach. The girls will gain knowledge on how to prepare for the workforce and will apply the training through an opportunity to practice what they learned through its partnership with Starbucks and Broward County Courthouse.

## **BFit**

### **American Heart Association, Inc., \$80,000**

#### Building a Healthier Broward

This pilot program will reduce hypertension among 300 targeted residents in the Lauderhill/Washington Park area. All participants are patients of a medical clinic and referred because they have high blood pressure. A patient navigator (registered nurse) will closely monitor each person and design individualized treatment plans and provide health coaching and fitness activities through a partnership with Urban League and YMCA.

### **H.O.M.E.S., Inc., \$67,500**

#### Outdoor Kitchen & Nutritional Learning Center

Sixty residents who live in the 13th Street corridor will be enrolled in this program that will provide healthy eating interactive education and fitness activities. The residents will have free access a community garden and work weekly with a chef to create healthy dishes in a new outdoor kitchen. In addition, and will create individualized eating plans and follow-up with each participant to ensure success.

### **Schott Communities, Inc., \$40,000**

#### BFit: Staying Healthy and Strong

This program will provide a comprehensive health and nutrition program for 70 special needs individuals. Participants will be engaged in daily exercises, adaptive vegetable gardening and cooking classes.

### **YMCA of South Florida, Inc., \$65,000**

#### IMPACT Program

A Community Health Worker will work with 100 residents who have a chronic health condition such as diabetes, hypertension or pre-diabetes. This program follows and evidenced-based model that is proven to create behavioral change and reduce obesity so their health will improve.

## **Art of Community**

### **City of Lauderhill, \$75,000**

#### Living With Wildlife

This project will work with residents to develop the design and installation of a mosaic tile splash pad at Wolk Park. The project will get residents to talk about the issues of co-existing with wildlife in their area considered to be both a nuisance and a benefit. The art will depict the urban wildlife of the area to spark conversation, raise awareness of the need for wildlife, and instill a sense of pride and appreciation to the 5000 residents who have this unique habitat in their community.

### **Grace Arts Center, Inc., \$35,000**

#### Art Work

Two major arts events will breathe new life in the Music & Art South of Sunrise (MASS) district. The COAT (Community of Artists Transform) event will transform the area into an art friendly environment due to the addition of a mural and wall sculptures. The second event, Art Ft. Lauderdale event will involve an art exhibit and designer showcase with installations of sculpture and visual art in residential landmark properties along Ft. Lauderdale's noted waterways. Professional artists will host educational panels to share the various aspects of design, archaeological, and cultural history of the area that will influenced the artwork produced for both events.

### **World AIDS Museum, Inc., \$23,000**

#### Never Again! The HIV/AIDS Inspired Project of Hope

A public art piece will be created to inspire residents and individuals living with HIV/AIDS that there is hope for a better future. The public will participate in a competition to design an art piece that depicts an inspirational image that brings recognition and awareness to what many deem a "forgotten population" and their struggle to survive and live a meaningful life. A panel of community leaders will select the finalists and host an awards ceremony to announce the winner. The winning artwork will serve as the design template of a large-scale outdoor sculpture at a prominent and permanent location in the City of Oakland Park.

### **Broward Cultural Division, \$35,000**

#### Creative Investment and Community Arts Education

This project will supplement seven local artists programs that provide dynamic and engaging art forms, which include performances, spoken word, hip-hop, filmmaking, theater, interactive arts, printmaking, culinary and visual art exhibits.

- **The Happening: A Theatrical Mixtape** produced by *Darius V. Daughtry* is a performance opportunity for new and emerging performers to fuse traditional theatrical formats with a unique blend of modern performance elements such as spoken word and hip-hop on a main stage. This will take place in July 2018 with a projected 200 residents to attend.
- **48 Hour Film Project** hosted by *Cathleen Dean* takes film making to a new level with engagement of "under the radar" film artists. Local filmmakers will create their own short films and the finalists' films will be shown during the screening event. This will take place in either Hollywood or Fort Lauderdale in June 2018 with an expected participation of more than 700 filmmakers and filmgoers.
- **Fågelbo** produced by *Jenny Larsson* in collaboration with the *Wildbeast Collective* is a dance concept that pairs artists from diverse disciplines and provides an outlet to create experimental works of art through dance. This will be performed during The Nerve, a FAT Village 3-day art festival, with an anticipated audience of 350 festivalgoers.
- **What's Your Elephant** hosted by *Nichole "Niki" Lopez* will provide a safe space for people to use the arts to have dialogue through interactive visuals and performing arts through workshops and art exhibits to provoke awareness and facilitate discussion through unveiling topics that people don't address or are hesitant to bring up (the elephant in the room).
- **Small Press Fair** produced by *Ingrid Schindall* will bring together local and regional artists, printers, authors and poets to share ideas and showcase their work. Last year this event has a huge draw of more than 150 artists and writers and more than 1,200 people in the audience and growing.
- **Caribbean Culinary Museum and Culinary Theater** presented by *Calibe Thompson* as part of the annual Test the Islands Experience event, which will bring flavors of the Islands to the Fort Lauderdale Historical Society in June 2018 during the first weekend of the Caribbean American Heritage Month.
- **Sailboat Bend Art Festival/Flager Village Block Party Weekend** produced by *Joshua Tiktin* will expand this biannual event to include a monthly two day arts festival at Peter Feldman Park. This project will bring out more than 450 residents to enjoy 35+ performances, view artwork and listen to live music, poets, comedians and DJ's.

### **Ashanti Cultural Arts, \$25,000**

DivrCity

Ashanti will broaden their arts platform and community reach to create a real arts ambiance in the NW Pompano Beach community through jazz. Nationally renowned and rising jazz musicians will be showcased on the Center's outdoor amphitheater stage. This will turn the Ali Cultural Center & Museum into a destination spot where people will want to come listen and feel the jazz vibe.

### **City of Tamarac, \$75,000**

Metamorphosis: A Community Transformation

The construction of Tamarac Village will create new storefronts with restaurants, shops and a park with greenspace. To complement the park, a new amphitheater and splash pad will be built to provide future entertainment and a place to live, work and play for residents and visitors. A mosaic tile mural will be created and used as the backdrop of the amphitheater and the splash pad flooring will have the same mosaic tile theme.

### **Coral Springs Museum of Art, \$50,000**

Healing with Art

This project will provide art therapy to help Marjorie Stoneman Douglas students, teachers, parents, and the community to cope with their emotions and anxieties. An art therapist will work with participants twice a week at the Museum where they can focus on creating arts (mandalas, painting or sketching) in a safe and relaxing environment. The art therapist will also perform evaluations with the participants to measure their level of anxiety, feeling of guilt and anger and their willingness to talk and deal with the trauma.

### **Dania Beach Community Redevelopment Agency, \$32,000**

Dania Beach: Honor the Legacy

The City of Dania Beach is in transition and the use of art is the perfect way to bridge the history with the new. Artists Gary Moore and historian Paul George will engage residents to tell their stories of the history of Broward's first city and determine the most significant ones to be captured through different art forms (murals, auditory displays, etc.) or art pieces (sculptures, plaques, etc.) to display throughout an eight-stop walking trail in the downtown area.

### **Fort Lauderdale Downtown Development Authority, \$30,000**

PACA Garage Art Mural

A parking garage will become the canvas for a beautiful mural with design input by Broward Center, Museum of Discovery and Science, City of Ft. Lauderdale and their patrons. The intent is for residents to fully enjoy the arts and entertainment district from the moment they step out of their car. The mural will be centrally located on the main portion of the garage at the corner of SE 2nd Street and SE 5th Avenue, across from BCPA and MODS.

### **Friends of Birch State Park, \$20,000**

Birch Aquarium Mural

This project will transform the tunnel that connects the beach to the park into an underwater mural aquarium. As thousands of residents and visitors walk through the tunnel, they will experience Florida's vast vital ocean wildlife including dolphins, manatees, sea turtles and more. Walkers will also feel connected and a sense of pride in the tropical paradise Broward offers.

### **Stonewall National Museum and Archives, \$50,000**

Our Night Out

A new Pride Weekend event will serve as a springboard for monthly offerings that will highlight live theater, film, music, choral concerts and more to create a new arts vibe in Wilton Manors. The intent is to foster inclusion by bringing together LGBT and non-LGBT residents and organizations for a fresh and novel culture experience that will last year-round and will enhance and celebrate the arts. In collaboration with Gay Men's Chorus, Island City Stage, and other organizations, Wilton Drive will be developed into a destination spot

where Broward residents from all over are attracted to Wilton Manors to enjoy art walks, pop-up exhibitions, music, food and each other

## Cancel Cancer

### **University of Miami Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center, \$200,000 over two years**

Precision Medicine in Broward: Personalized Molecular Tests for Cancer Patients

140 metastatic cancer patients from Broward will have their tumors analyzed to help doctors improve their clinical outcomes, identify therapeutic targets, and to understand molecular differences in patients of various demographic backgrounds. Patients will be enrolled at satellite centers in Plantation, Deerfield Beach, Coral Springs and Hollywood in precision medical clinical trials or prescribed treatment with commercially available therapies that are paired with patients' molecular alteration.

### **Holy Cross Hospital, Bienes Cancer Center, \$100,000**

Precision Medicine

200 Broward cancer patients will receive personalized precision treatments based on molecular testing and SNaPShot of their tumors and blood and connected to the best clinical trials for their cancers.

### **Nova Southeastern University, \$70,000**

Evaluation of JFD Compound for Treatment of Brain Cancers

To continue research on laboratory subjects to confirm the effectiveness of JFD in controlling the growth of tumors in the brain. It is anticipated that JFD will be approved for clinical trial by 2020.

### **American Cancer Society, Inc., \$20,000**

Road to Recovery – Medical Transportation Assistance

Door-to-door transportation service will be provided to 100 patients undergoing cancer treatment. This approach reduces the strain on the family and/or caretaker while the patients have easy and relaxing conveyance to their appointments.

### **Gilda's Club, \$50,000**

Cancer Care Mind Body Connection

400 cancer patients and their families/caregivers will participate in a combination of support groups, workshops, and healthy lifestyle programs, individuals will learn to cope with anxiety, stress and depression. The support groups will be facilitated by a licensed mental health professional to ensure that no one faces cancer alone. In addition, they will also work to improve their health by participating in yoga and/or nutritional classes that will help to improve their overall well-being.

### **H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute Foundation, \$30,000**

Survivorship Program: Care Plan Delivery

60 Broward patients will be enrolled into the Journey Forward Cancer Care Plan after successfully completing their initial cancer treatment. The program will work to ensure their long-term quality of life and decrease the risk for recurrence of the cancer.

## Animal Welfare

### **Cats Exclusive, Inc., \$10,000**

Low-Income Clinic Subsidy

Help 70 low-income pet owners with assistance to adequately maintain the health of their cats with needed services.

### **Florida Research Institute for Equine Nurturing, Development & Safety (F.R.I.E.N.D.S.), \$25,000**

Horse Rescue and Sanctuary

25 rescued horses will be provided with food, medical care and needed treatment. Horses with Equine Infectious Anemia as well as those who have been abused and neglected will live free in a healthy and safe environment.

### **Humane Society of Broward County, Inc., \$35,000**

Surrender Prevention

70 pet owners who otherwise would not be able to keep their pet will be provided with emergency assistance, such as surgical procedures, medicine, vaccines, pet behavior counseling, food and more.

### **Pet Project for Pets, Inc., \$15,000**

Keeping Pets at Home – Saving More Pets

100 seniors or individuals with disabilities who are financially unable to care for their pet will receive help with pet food, supplies, annual vaccines and reduced cost for medical care, to help the owners keep their companion pet in their home.

### **South Florida Wildlife Center, Inc., \$15,000**

Rehabilitate and Educate

Help 150 injured wildlife with veterinary care, medication, special diets and rehabilitation. They are cared for in a customized habitat where they will develop important skills to aid the transition back into their natural environment once released back into the wild.

## **ECO Broward**

### **National Wildlife Federation, Inc., \$90,000 over two years**

Broward Habitat Connectivity Project

This project will continue its ongoing progress in Lauderhill and Lauderdale Lakes over the next two years. 10 natural habitat buffer zones will be created in North Lauderdale, Sunrise, Margate and Tamarac. Additionally, 20,000 trees will be planted and 300 properties will be certified as wildlife habitats.

### **The Everglades Foundation, Inc., \$45,000**

The Everglades Literacy and Champion School Recognition program

Implement the Everglades Literacy program to create Everglades-literate citizenry by training 50 Broward school teachers who will educate 1,500 Broward students. Additionally, the Everglades Champion School program will be expanded through a series of challenges. Students will conduct research and develop new technologies as it relates to ecosystem restoration, water quality and specie preservation that will be featured at the Everglades Literacy Conference.

### **Youth Environmental Alliance, Inc., \$120,000 over two years**

Project ROC! Reclaiming Our Coastline

Will engage residents while improving coastal resiliency through beach clean-ups, removal of invasive vegetation and planting of eco-friendly and native plants. This will address critically eroded shorelines and reverse coastal habitat loss by restoring 16 sand dunes over two years.

## **Broward Pride**

### **Equality Florida, Inc. \$150,000 over three years**

Safe and Healthy Schools

This multi-pronged program will be implemented over a three-year period to institutionalize a culture of inclusion and acceptance of all LGBTQ students from elementary to high school within Broward County Public Schools. 100% of the District schools will have training and support to meet the social-emotional needs of LGBTQ students and to foster allies from their straight peers and faculty. A dedicated SAFE Liaison from each

school will provide support as needed. In addition, LGBTQ students, parents, teachers and administrators will convene quarterly to address inclusion, acceptance and improve school climate.

**Keystone Halls, Inc. \$ 75,000**

LGBTQ Transitional Housing

To provide transitional housing for 40 LGBTQ individuals experiencing homelessness. LGBTQ sensitive wrap-around case management will connect them to critical services that include mental health and substance abuse counseling, help to secure employment and permanent housing, legal assistance, life skills training, and connection to healthcare that will help participants achieve stability.

**Museum of Discovery and Science, Inc. \$85,000**

LGBTQ+ Inclusion Initiative at MODS

To provide a year round Museum inclusivity initiative shaped and supported by an advisory committee comprised of approximately twelve LGBTQ+ community leaders and advocates. Reaching approximately 4,000 LGBTQ+ community residents will create a more inclusive Museum to serve the community, formulate and enhance inclusivity practices and ultimately improve accessibility along with perceptions of accessibility, through a formal LGBTQ+ engagement strategy focused on community partnerships, staff training, target marketing and specialized programming.

**NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale, Inc. \$40,000**

A Sense of Pride

This new program will rebrand the Museum and turn it into a hub for the arts that will connect the LGBT community with dynamic offerings. The program will expand on established educational programs to engage and inspire conversation through the arts with interactive arts performances, workshops and more. Through collaboration with John Knox Village, the Union group at NSU (the LGBTQIA+ student group) it will increase visibility to all residents what issues the LGBT community are facing today.

**SunServe, Inc. \$50,000**

LGBTQ Cultural Competency Training & Consulting

This new model program is unique in its outreach to create a culture shift within municipalities. SunServe will provide LGBT sensitivity training to 390 employees that work directly with residents in six Broward cities, i.e. first responders, customer service and sanitation staff. To ensure implementation of the training, follow-up sessions will be held with the appropriate staff. In addition, each city will have their policies reviewed to identify areas where inclusive language can be improved. A full-time training specialist will be hired to implement this program.

## Dignity in Aging

**Center for Hearing and Communication in Florida, \$90,000**

H.E.A.R. for Seniors

This program will reduce the waiting list for the H.E.A.R. program by serving 150 additional seniors who are 80 years and older. The Outreach Specialist and Case Manager will work with the seniors to assess their hearing needs, mental health, basic needs and address safety concerns in their homes. Assistive audio devices like flashing telephones and doorbells will be installed as needed. Staff will work with a minimum of 75 caregivers to provide support and connect them to resources in the community.

**Memorial Foundation, Inc. \$90,000**

ALLIES

This program will add an additional part-time case manager to meet the needs of 150 seniors 80 years and older who will receive wrap-around case management service with in-home visits and environmental safety scans. Seniors will participate in social activities and weekly “Keep Your Independence” lectures. Four different senior and community centers will participate in these sessions (Hallandale Beach Cultural Center,

Austin Hepburn Human Services Center, Hollywood Beach Cultural Center and Boulevard Heights Community Center).

**Mount Olive Development Corp, Inc. \$120,000**

Senior Connection

This program for seniors 80+ will launch a new location in Hallandale to complement the Sistrunk location. Participants meet three times per week with counselors to address their needs and engage them socially to improve their overall mental and physical health. The program will continue to provide holistic wellness support that integrates fitness, health education, social activities and connection to local services. Transportation and food are included in both programs. In addition, 25 caregivers will participate in bi-monthly support groups to help them cope with anxiety and reduce their stress levels.

**SoFia \$50,000**

Caregiver Assistance

This program will serve 110 caregivers of seniors 80+ in their homes to provide one-on-one support. The Caregiver Assistance Coordinator and a social worker intern will conduct an initial in-home assessment of the caregiver and loved ones' needs. A respite volunteer will visit their home weekly to give the caregiver a break. In addition, the Caregiver Assistance Coordinator will visit the caregiver to provide support in addressing their own well-being issues.

## Field of Interest

**University of Miami \$11,369**

Research and Treatment of Arthritis-Related Diseases

The University of Miami Miller School of Medicine, Division of Rheumatology will perform research studies to understand the causes of arthritis-related diseases, and will provide resources to improve the management of Broward County patients with arthritis-related diseases. Thirty new patients per week will enter this project to continue the study of pathogenesis and response to therapy.

**Planned Parenthood of South, East & North Florida \$36,107**

Teen Time

A Community Health Educator will deliver age-appropriate, medically accurate, comprehensive sexual health education to a minimum of 600 Broward teens, ages 12-17. Participants will gain knowledge and skills that equip them to avoid risky behaviors, resist coercion and make healthy choices. Through outreach events, 3,000 teens will receive critical preventive health information and be alerted to the availability of reproductive and sexual health care services.

**Museum of Discovery and Science \$29,920**

Beyond the Karman Line

This project will ignite, instill and further a passion for all things space through its permanent space exhibit. A plethora of public programming, outreach to 500 students from Title 1 schools, BECON TV programming, IMAX films, space-focused day camps and a field trip to Kennedy Space Center for 50 students.

**Crockett Foundation \$20,000**

Kennedy Space Center Trip and Camp

This project will provide 40 at-risk students the opportunity to participate in space education during a six-week summer camp and also travel to the Kennedy Space Center to explore and be inspired by space and aviation. The goal is to plant a seed of curiosity for students to pursue a non-traditional career in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) field.

**Anti-Defamation League \$19,529**

No Place for Hate

This project will provide anti-bias education and professional training to 12 Broward County schools impacting approximately 9,000 students. The project will work with the schools to develop a framework for building and sustaining a school culture that promotes inclusion and respect.

**Rebuilding Together \$80,000**

Broward Cares – Hurricane Preparation

This project will provide home repair and storm mitigation for low-income residents, with a preference for elderly homeowners, who do not have the resources to safeguard their home to be hurricane ready. They will identify a geographic area where to concentrate mitigation, such as installing storm shutters, cutting trees, and other minor repairs to safeguard the home.
